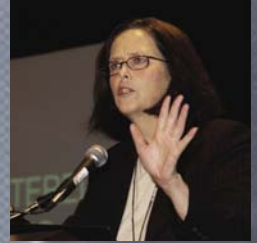
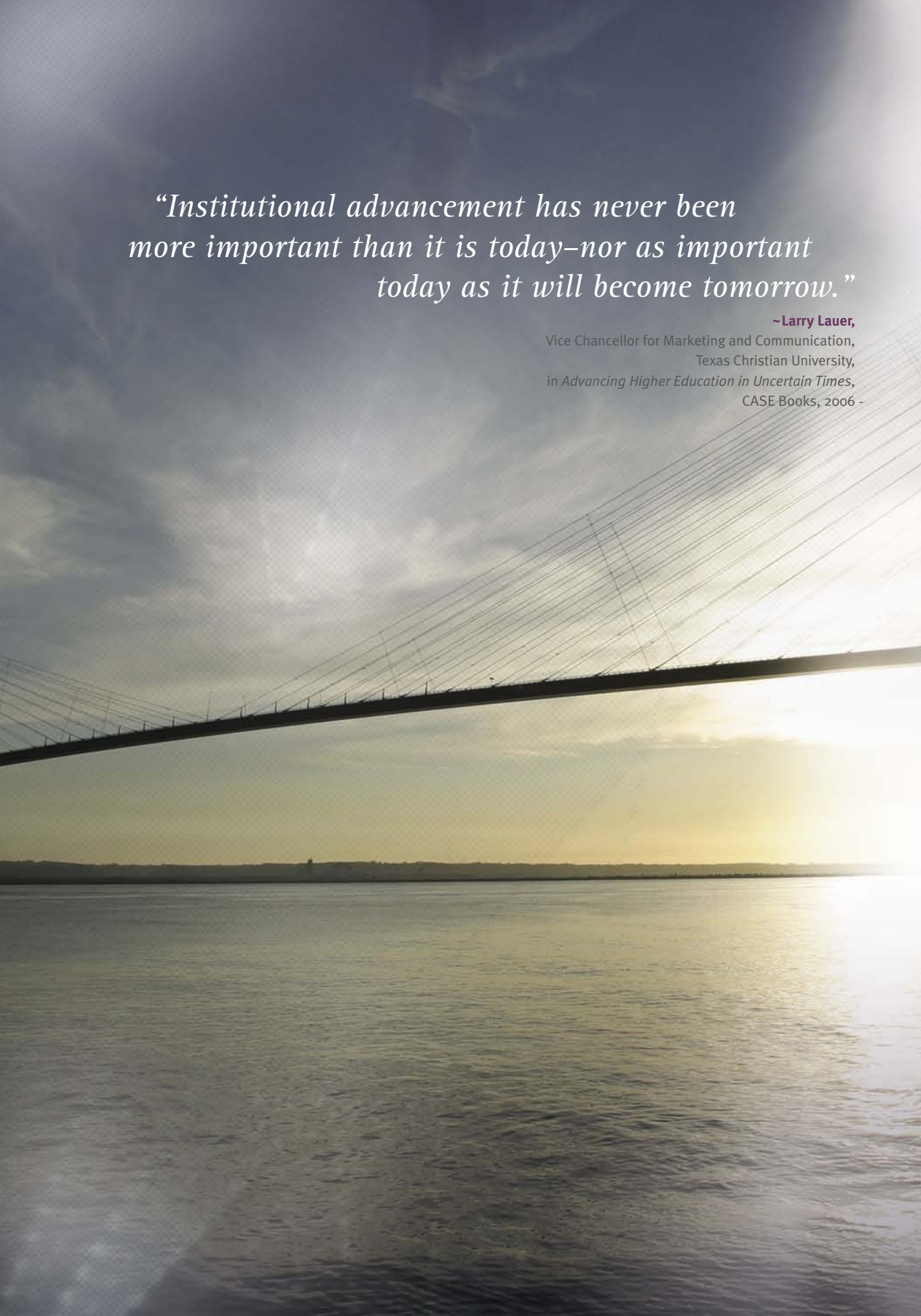

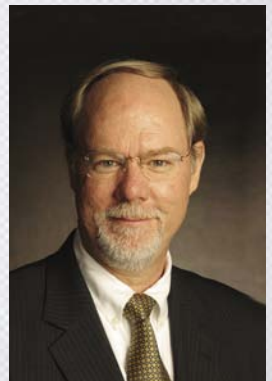
Beyond the numbers, CASE made significant advances that we believe will help our association, as well as the field of advancement, to grow and evolve.

The Council for Advancement and Support of Education is the leading professional association for advancement professionals who support educational institutions through their work in alumni relations, communications, marketing and development.

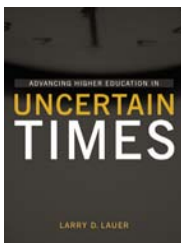

Highlights from 2005-06 that reflect CASE's commitment to this mission:



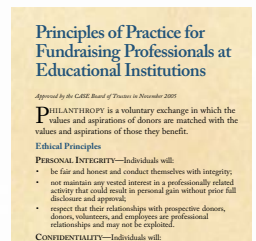
- Served nearly 16,800 participants at 105 face-to-face CASE conferences and workshops around the world
- Delivered 16 Online Speaker Series programs to 1,940 sites (a 44 percent increase) and as many as 13,692 individuals (a 27 percent increase)
- Held our first-ever comprehensive conference in Singapore, drawing 440 delegates from 30 countries and opening the door for a permanent presence in the Asia-Pacific region
- Made significant progress on an initiative sponsored by the Carnegie Corp. to help six universities in Africa build advancement programs and secured a US \$300,000 grant to continue the effort
- Established an advisory council to determine next steps to grow advancement support in Mexico following a successful conference there
- Laid the groundwork to reposition the annual CASE conference as a summit for advancement leaders to address the critical challenges facing higher education

While CASE is the largest association of educational institutions in the world, our goal has never been to be the biggest. Our vision has always been to be the best—the best at serving our individual and institutional members while setting standards and promoting practices that engender respect for the profession.

Highlights from 2005-06 that reflect CASE's commitment to this vision:

- Launched new CASE Principles of Practice for fundraisers and periodicals editors
- Introduced the CASE Management Checklist for Development to help development managers conduct internal self-assessments of programs
- Expanded the CASE Network (www.case.org) to include organizational charts, sample Web policies and additional job descriptions
- Launched a set of downloadable e-guides for independent schools following a similar series for community colleges
- Collaborated to promote an interactive CD tutorial, CASE's first ever, on data mining
- Collaborated on a HigherEd BlogCon, a month-long blog event on the use of new media in education
- Published the results of a comprehensive compensation survey of advancement professionals in *CURRENTS* magazine
- Represented the profession through dozens of interviews with media representatives interested in capital campaigns, alumni engagement, issues management, and more
- Forged continued partnerships with other organizations that serve advancement professionals, including the National Association of Independent Schools and the Council of Alumni Association Executives
- Collaborated with other organizations to advocate for legislation beneficial to charitable organizations and philanthropy
