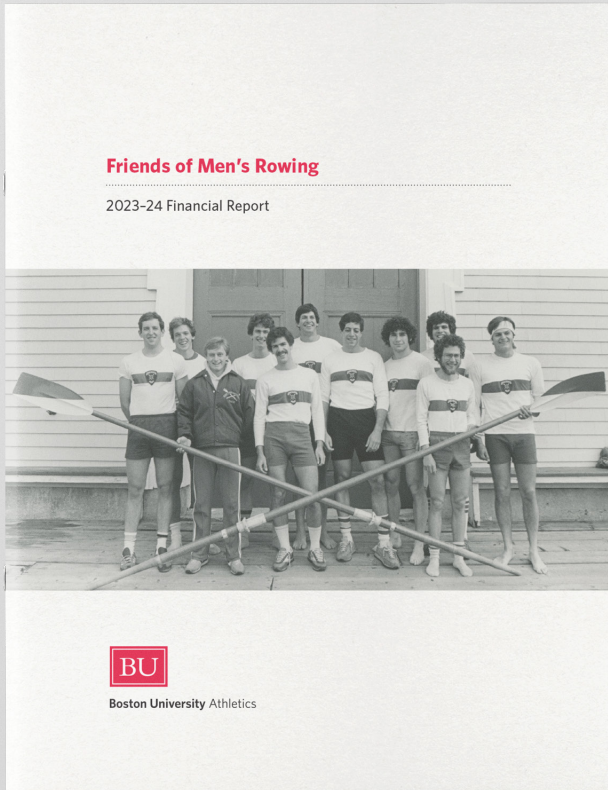

## NOTE FROM THE HEAD COACH

Dear Friends of Men's Rowing,

I am pleased to present you with the *Friends of Men's Rowing 2023/2024 Financial Report*. This report outlines and reviews our operating costs along with the total money raised during the past fiscal year. The report also outlines our projected budget and fundraising goals for 2024/2025, and it reviews the growth in our endowments. Most importantly, we would like to recognize the alumni, parents, and friends that support our program and are fundamental to our success.

As we move forward, it is important that the *Financial Report* provides a clear picture of the cost to operate the program and how the program is funded. **The team's operating costs—equipment, training trips, travel for racing, recruiting (coaching travel and recruiting visits), clothing, entry fees, senior banquet, and other items—are 100% covered by donations to our Friends of Men's Rowing Account and income generated from our endowments.** It's essential to note that the Department of Athletics remains supportive of other areas of our program, including scholarships, facility maintenance, salaries, and more.

Thanks to the program's alumni, parents, and friends, we had an excellent year in our fundraising efforts. We received commitments to support the endowments and achieved our annual goal of raising more than \$ [redacted] for the Friends of Men's Rowing.

Our fundraising strategy continues to be for our alumni, parents, and friends to support the program whenever it is convenient during the year. Donors have the opportunity to give during events such as Terriers Together in October and Giving Day in April, as well as at the end of the calendar year and BU's fiscal year in June.

I would also like to take this opportunity to formally announce the kick off of the BU Men's Rowing Endowment Campaign. The current value of our endowments total \$ [redacted], and our goal as part of this campaign is to reach \$ [redacted] by January 2025 and \$ [redacted] by January 2026.

Collegiate athletics programs have changed significantly. Recruiting high-level athletes has become more competitive; programs are taking multiple training trips per year and are routinely racing at the highest caliber events, like Henley. With change comes opportunity—opportunity to continue to recruit, retain, and grow our student-athletes, providing them with a first-class experience at our world-class institution. **Ensuring long-term financial stability through programmatic endowments will allow BU Men's Rowing to remain one of the premier programs in the country.**

We already have reached out to many of our supporters about the campaign and opportunities to partner together as we work towards this ambitious goal. We're grateful for the commitments we've received and are excited to spread the word on the importance of this initiative.

I always say that the strength of our alumni, family, and friends is in our numbers—a lot of you helping each year. **I am proud and thankful for all of you.**

Total Annual Giving to Friends of Men's Rowing

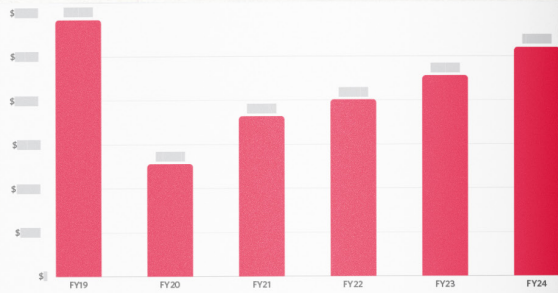


Figure 1: Total annual giving to the Friends of Men's Rowing account from FY19 to FY24. We have continued to experience growth, rebounding well from 2020.

Annual Spending Breakdown

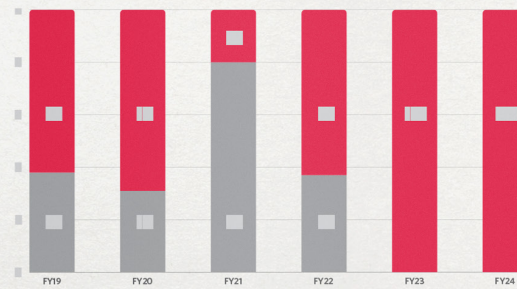

## Annual Spending Breakdown for Operating Expenses

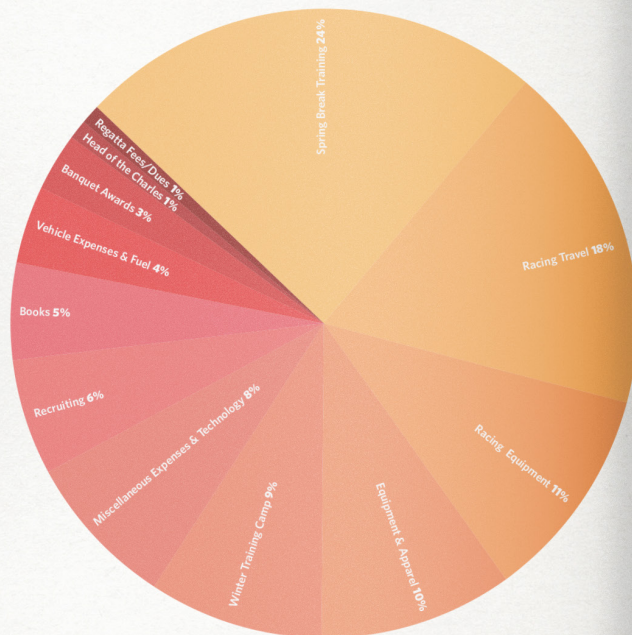


Figure 4: Breakdown of costs to operate BU Men's Rowing in FY24.

**Spring Break Training (24%)** covers costs associated with weeklong camp in Clemson, SC, including flights, food, hotel, bus transportation, and boat transport from Boston. These costs were higher in 2023-24 due to the increased price of air travel.

**Racing Travel (18%)** includes hotel, transportation (flights/bus), and food for races. Travel for 2023-24 included fall scrimmage with Dartmouth in Hanover, NH; Lake Morey Invite in Fairlee, VT; and Eastern Sprints. IRA Championships travel is covered by the BU Athletic Department.

**Racing Equipment (11%)** includes boats, oars, ergs, and riggers. One (1) used racing shell was purchased in 2023-24.

**Equipment & Apparel (10%)** covers training gear—both for on the water and in the weight room—issued to the team each year. Some gear, such as backpacks, duffle bags, racing suits, and splash jackets, are issued once every four years.

**Winter Training Camp (9%)** covers costs for weeklong training camp in Newport Beach, CA. Athletes paid for flights to California, and the program paid for flights home. Costs also include hotel, food, van rental, and equipment rental from Orange Coast College.

**Miscellaneous Expenses & Technology (8%)** includes fundraising expenses, technology expenses, and a portion of assistant coach salary and benefits.

**Recruiting (6%)** includes coaching travel to visit rowing programs around the US and abroad, inviting recruits on official visits to campus, and travelling to regattas such as US Youth Nationals, Jr. World Championships, and Henley Royal Regatta.

**Books (5%)** purchased for team members that maintain a 3.2 GPA (cumulative) after freshman year, as per the program's policy. Average cost for books is \$800 per year.

**Vehicle Expenses & Fuel (4%)** includes truck and trailer for travel and launch fuel. These costs include an unexpected vehicle repair and the rise in cost of diesel fuel.

**Banquet/Awards (3%)** includes end-of-year Senior Banquet, team awards, hosted dinner for team and families, and gifts for seniors and award winners.

**Head of the Charles (1%)** includes racing fees, administration, and alumni and family reception expenses.

**Regatta Fees/Dues (1%)** includes entry fees for Eastern Sprints and IRA Regatta, US Rowing dues, IRCA dues, referee fees for home races, and row2k subscription.

The BU Men's Rowing program established its first endowment fund in 1972. In keeping with the vision of former Head Coach Rodney Pratt, four additional funds were established in 1994. "The goal of the endowments," Pratt said, "is to generate enough yearly income to support the operational needs of the program, without having to rely on the athletic budget or yearly fundraising initiatives." It is Head Coach Tom Bohrer's mission to get the program to that level.

Today, the program has eight endowment funds\*:

## ENDOWMENT FUNDS AND GOALS

BU Men's Rowing will use \$ [redacted] generated from the endowment to help finance the FY2024-25 operating budget.

Previously, all income generated by the funds was reinvested in the endowment. We have also invested \$ [redacted] over the last six years from money raised during BU's annual Giving Day. This year, if we hit our fundraising goals, we will invest another \$ [redacted] into the endowment.

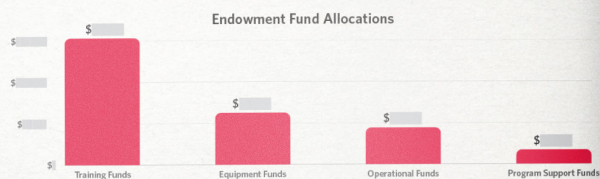


Figure 5: Total Endowment allocation is \$ [redacted] (an increase of [redacted] % over 2023-24 value).

### Endowment Goals

Our goal is to grow the endowment funds to a level that covers 100% of the operational needs of the program or covers a significant portion of the annual operational budget.

To that end, we aim to:

- Grow endowment funds from \$ [redacted] to \$ [redacted] by December 31, 2024. Based on a [redacted] % return, this could produce \$ [redacted]-\$ [redacted] in income each year.

The Nesworthy Club recognizes the longest-tenured head coach in program history, Jim Nesworthy. Coach Nesworthy's contributions to the program are legendary. He coached the program from 1948-64 and served in the Pacific during World War II. Coach Nesworthy was a champion of the importance of teamwork. He once said, "In crew we have no Saturday heroes. No sparkling last-minute goal line stands or spectacular thrills that come with a diving catch, circus-pass catching, or breathtaking puck shot...ours is the long, arduous grind in the cold, snow, or rain [that requires rowers] to exhibit a self-discipline rarely found in other sports."
