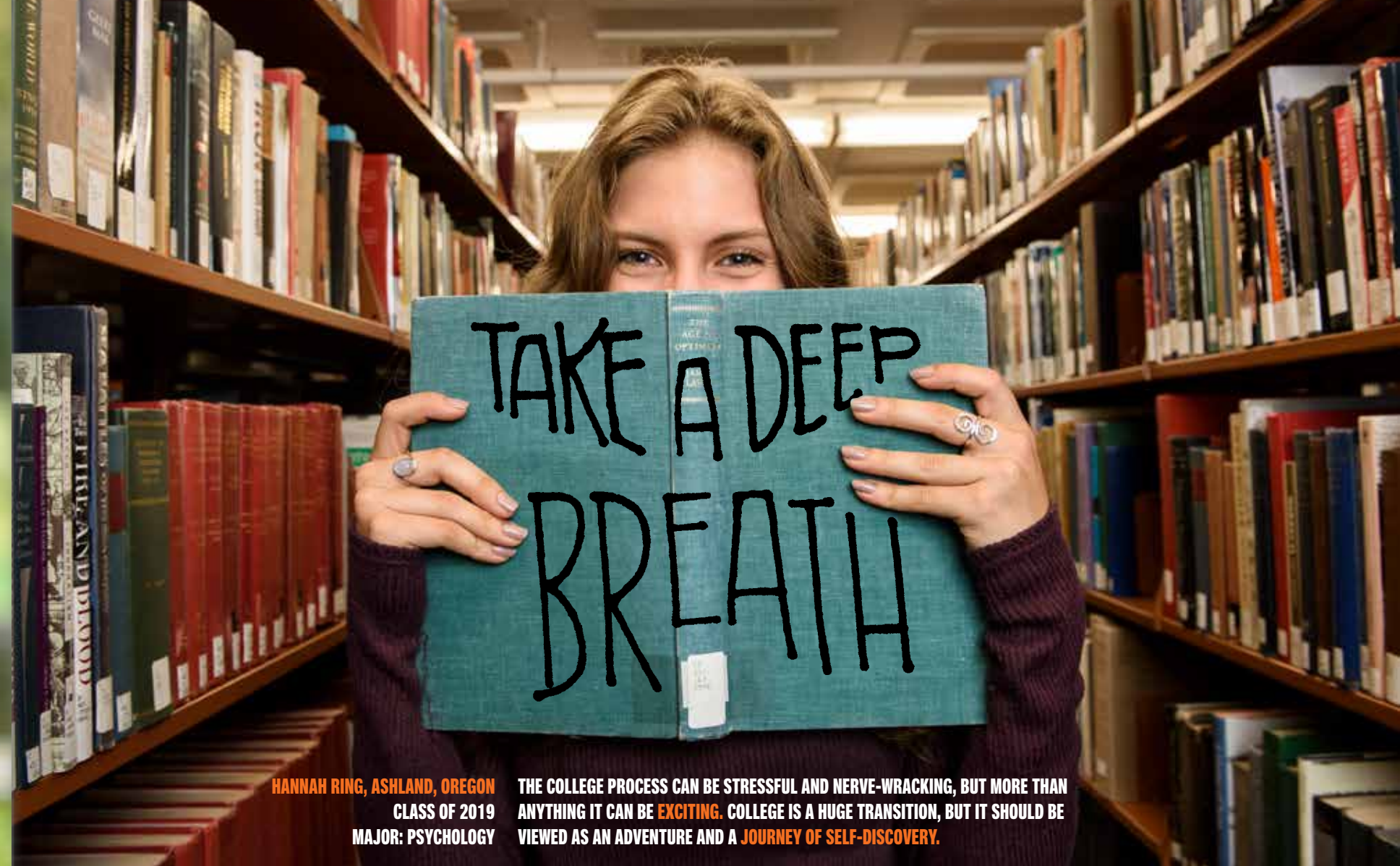

Now I work in that same lab, on the national Adolescent Brain Cognitive Development study. I administer neuropsychological tests and interviews, as well as operate MRI scans. In 10 years, this study will likely have changed the way in which we view and approach adolescent brain development.

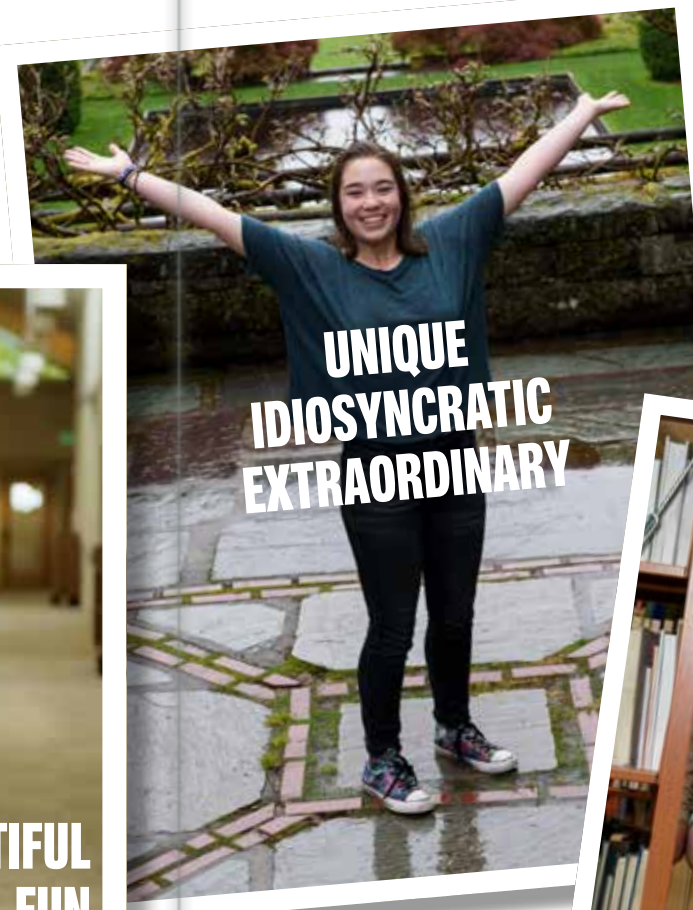

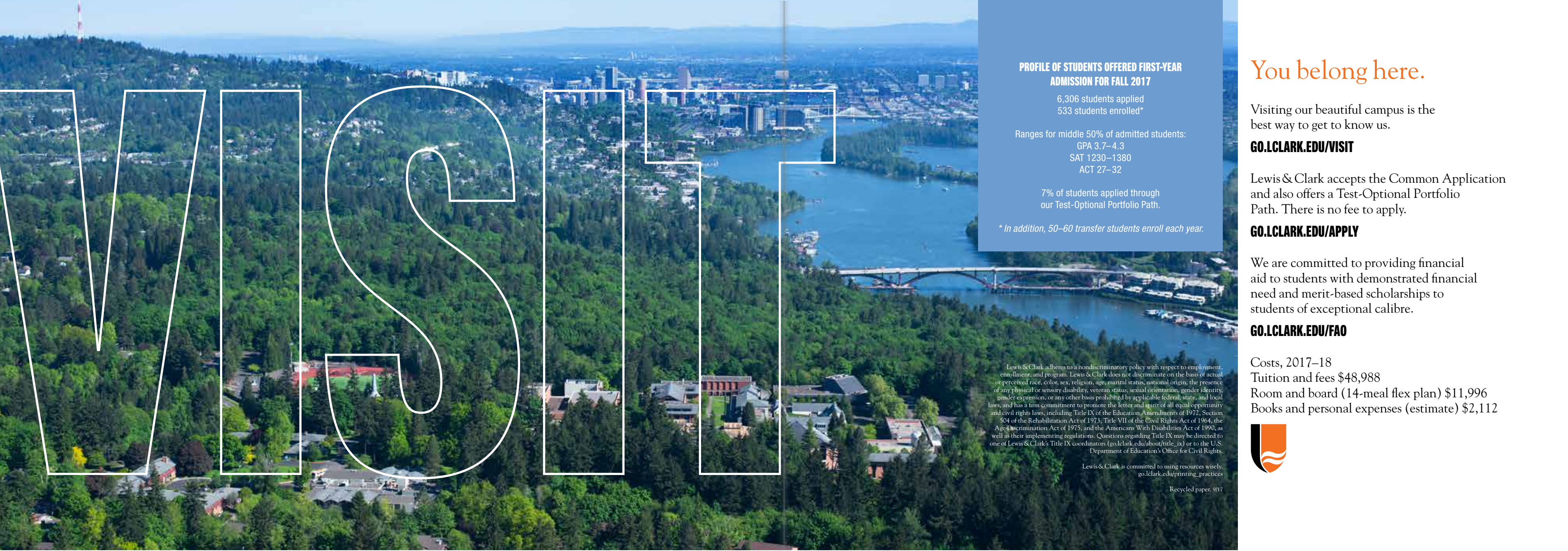
