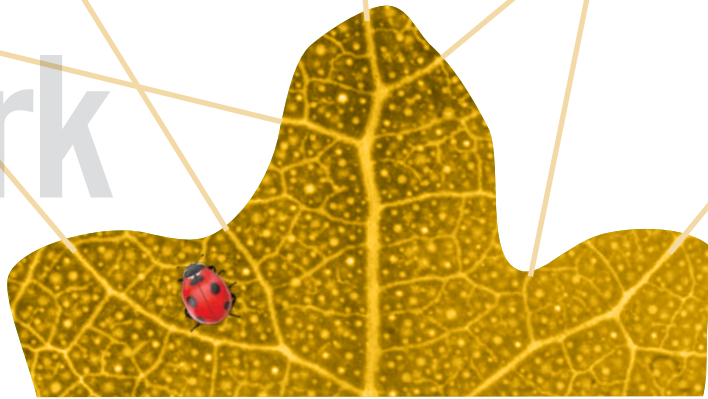

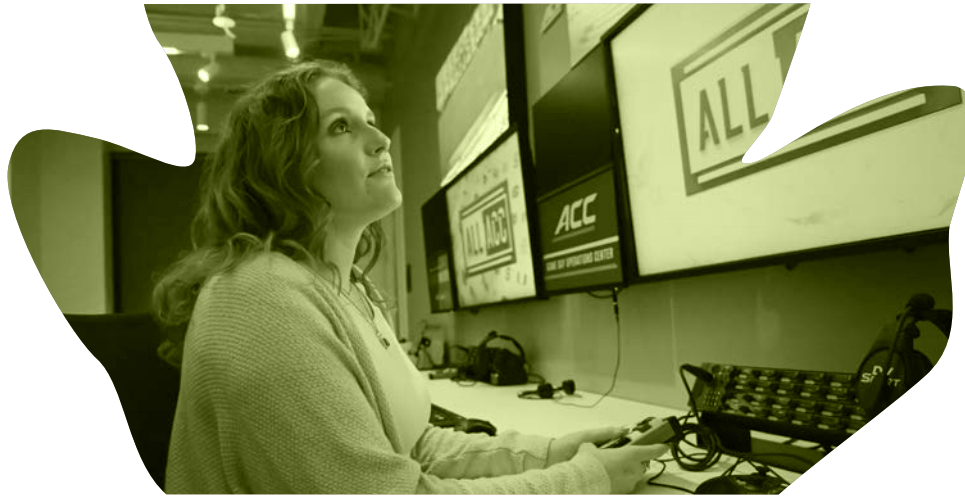


## Make Connections

Join *Elon Volunteers!* Participate in an Alternative Break program. Become one of the 79% of Elon students who give back through service.

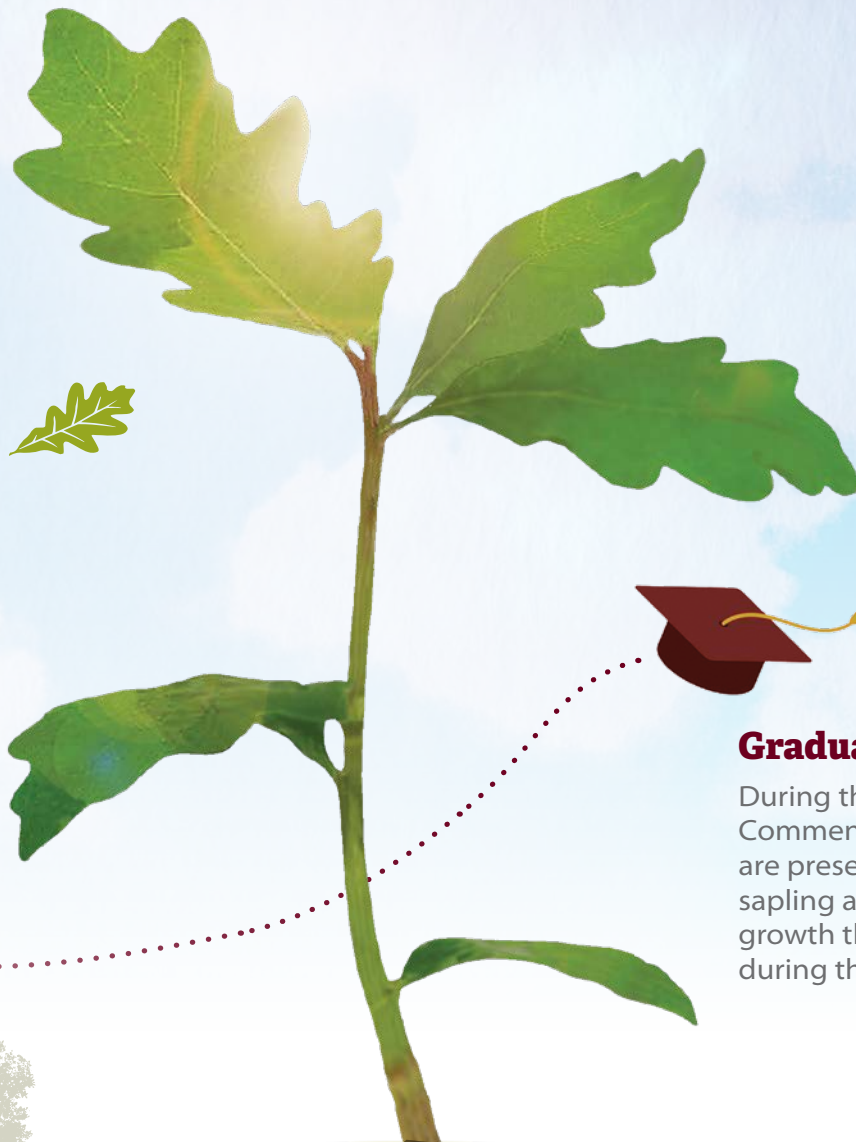

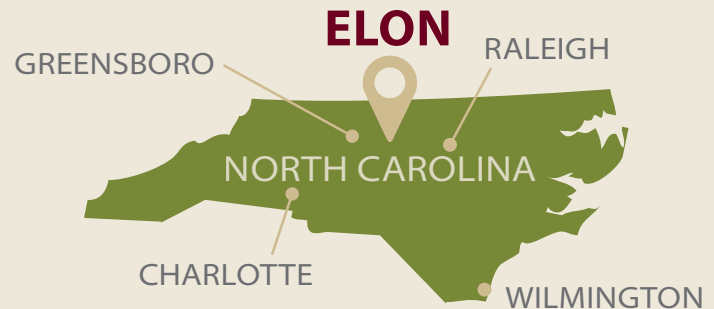

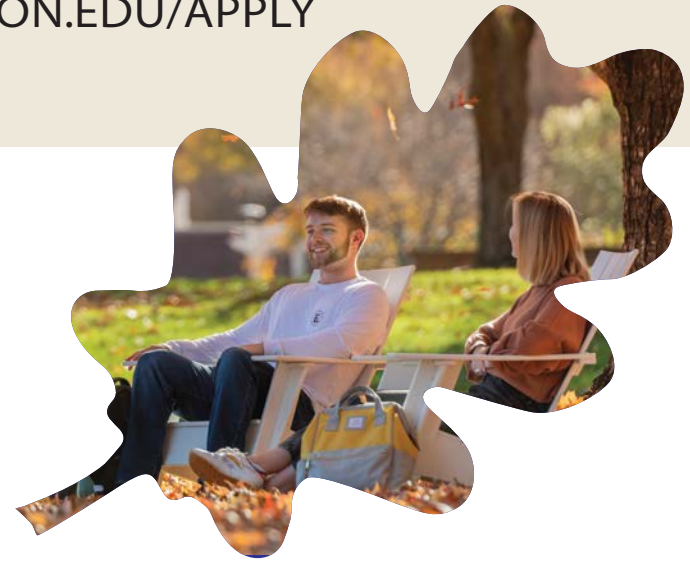

## National Campus Programs

Elon's National Campus Programs are located in metropolitan areas that offer students opportunities to pursue internships, earn academic credit and explore the global impact of these vibrant, diverse urban centers.



### Elon in Charlotte

(Fall and Summer)



Live and learn in the Queen City. The fall program is an opportunity for students

who want to experience a "semester of sport." Earn 14-18 credits during the semester, 2-4 of which are internship credits along with 3-4 other courses. Summer in Charlotte is open to all majors and students earn 6 credits through a 4-credit course and a 2-credit internship.

### Elon in Los Angeles

(Spring and Summer)



Intern in your field of interest, build your network and experience global diversity while earning 18 credits in

the spring or six in the summer.

Elon's alumni network is large and growing rapidly; many alumni are former Elon in LA participants. This program is open to all majors.

### Elon in New York City

(Fall, Spring and Summer)



Absorb the sights and sounds of diverse cultures while building your

network in this exciting program open to all majors. Spend your summer earning academic credit and professional experience for your career through an internship. Study in the fall or spring while earning a full semester of credit through an internship and courses with our partner, Marymount Manhattan College.

### Elon in Washington, D.C.

(Fall, Spring and Summer)



Head to the nation's capital for a nine-week (summer) or 15-week (semester)

internship program. Earn academic course credit by participating in an internship, evening course and LEAD (Leadership, Engagement, Achievement and Development) colloquium. Create a professional portfolio that will prepare you for the next steps in your career. Open to all majors, this is the perfect opportunity to get a glimpse of the inner workings of D.C. and learn from leaders in a variety of areas.
