














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Historically Modern.

1876

Hathaway Brown is a school that was founded by its own students, when five determined young women marched up the steps of the all-boys Brooks Military Academy to petition the headmaster to enroll them as well. What began as "afternoon classes for young ladies" grew into one of the nation's premier independent schools dedicated to women's education and empowerment. While the Brooks Military Academy closed its doors in 1891, HB still proudly stands, welcoming girls of strong character and academic promise throughout Northeast Ohio.

1886

The school was named for beloved headmistress Anne Hathaway Brown, who adopted the motto that continues to guide our work: Non Scholae Sed Vitae Discimus—We Learn Not for School, But for Life. She also chose the school colors of brown and gold to signify that HB is an institution rooted in the earth, but reaching for the sun.



1927

Dr. Mary Frances "Fran" Bisselle joined a powerful succession of HB leaders, installed as the 14th head of school.






HB's Institute for 21st Century Education.
