


Who participated?

139 first-gen alumni

- 63% wrote narratives
- 48% were women (of 93 reporting gender)
 - Relative to 39% in regular 2019 class books
- 83% of participants went to high school in the US (of 103)


 Relative to regular class books, first-gen participants come from more recent classes



What did first-gen students write about?


Relative to the regular 2019 red book narratives, first-gen students were more likely to write about...

- Family background
 - My parents were
 - Immigrants
 - Taught me that
- Coming to Harvard
 - My acceptance
 - Encouraged me to apply
 - Financial aid, aid package

Generational differences in narratives

First-gen classes **2000 and earlier** were more likely to write about...

- high [school]
- father
- Intellectual
- admissions
- sisters/brothers
- immigrants
- educator
- security

First-gen classes **after 2000** were more likely to write about...

- I learned
- *share* [*my experience*, *stories*]
- change [life change, change the world]
- Master's
- communities
- everyone around me
- Harvard university

Gender differences in narratives

Women were more likely to write about growth, community, and socio-economic status...


- what I [know, needed, believe]
- I wanted [to pursue, to learn, to study]
- poor
- to share [experiences, stories]
- husband

Men were more likely to write about parents and student experiences...

- Massachusetts
- of my parents
- after graduation
- as a student
- advanced [classes, management, level]


Participation in alumni events

A higher percentage of first-gen alumni participated in alumni events in 2019 than in preceding years since 2013




Participation "intensity"


While participation rate has increased, the average number of events attended *per person* has stayed flatter



Majority of first-generation alumni went to high school in the US.




Where did the first-generation alumni move globally?
